What Is a Collaborative Community?



Collaborative communities are continuing forums where public and private sector members proactively work together to:

- Achieve common objectives and outcomes
- Solve shared challenges
- Leverage collective opportunities in an environment of trust, respect, empathy and openness.

What Collaborative Communities Are *Not*

- They are NOT led by the FDA.
- They are NOT convened by the FDA.
- They do NOT exist to advise the FDA.
- Their membership and governance are NOT directed by the FDA.
- They are NOT task forces, working groups, or commissions.

What Makes Collaborative Communities Different?

	Task Force	<i>Collaborative Community</i>
Establishment	Usually initiated by a government entity	<i>Convened by external partner, but the FDA may be a member of the community</i>
Goals	Provides specific recommendations to address a single issue or concern	<i>Focused on broader outcomes and impacts May have multiple deliverables for each work stream</i>
Lifespan	Limited duration	<i>Sustained duration with a potentially indefinite lifespan</i>
Members	Involves a more focused group, usually not all stakeholders	<i>All stakeholders are brought into the effort and have an equal voice in decisions</i>

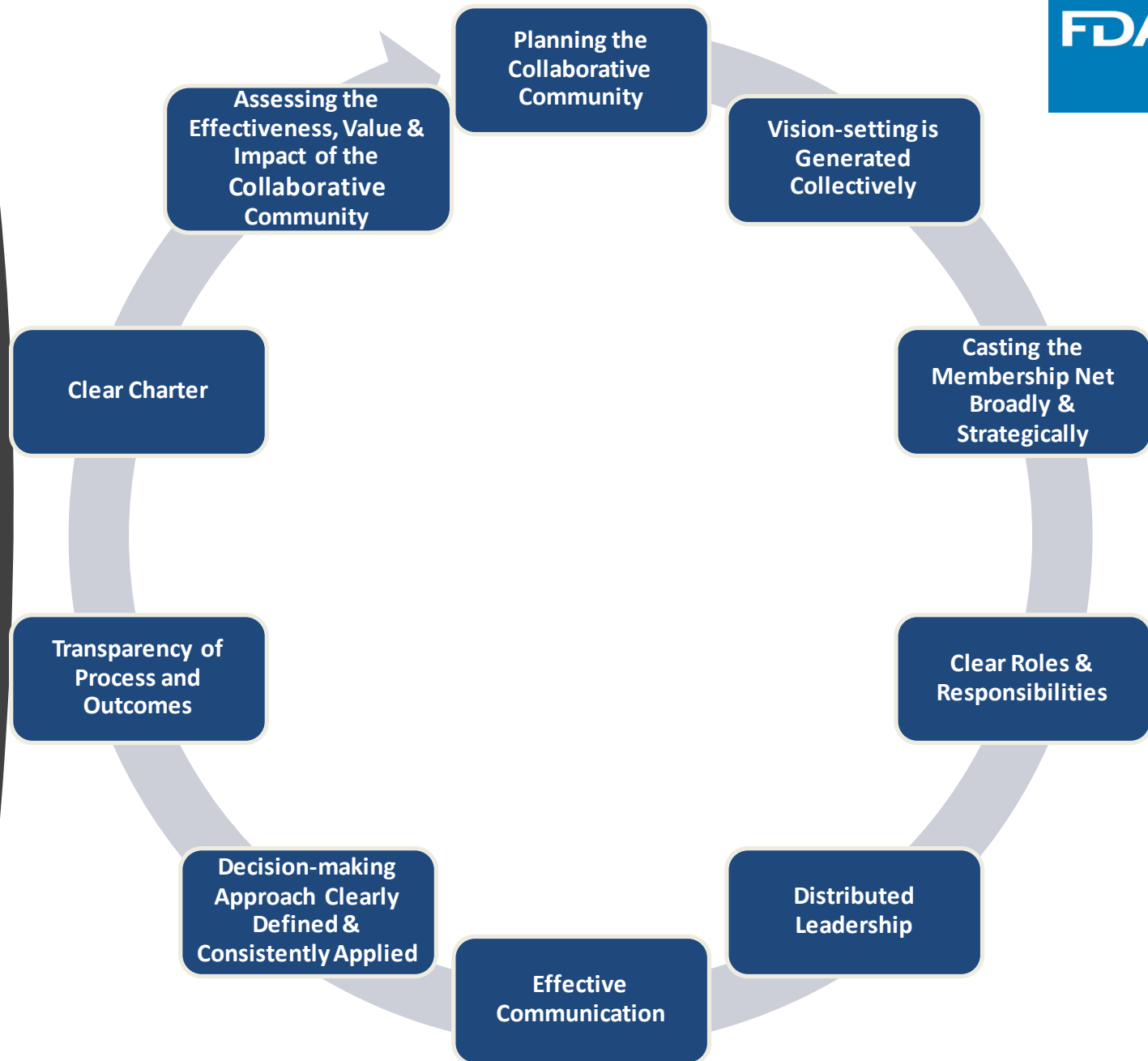
